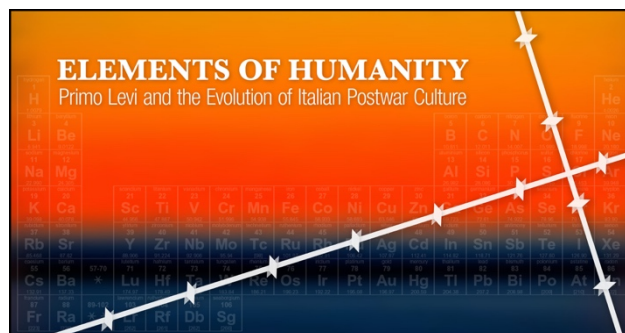


Suggestions for further reading

Excellent resources exist in English for anyone wishing to engage further with Primo Levi's writings and their implications, both directly and through scholarship dedicated to Levi's life and works. Indeed, together with the important editions in the Primo Levi Collection, displayed in this exhibition, the Hesburgh Library's holdings include a wide-ranging collection of scholarly works for research and study in this area.



Of particular interest to visitors to this exhibition will be:

Primo Levi, *Complete Works*. Ed. Ann Goldstein. 3 vols. New York: Liveright, 2015.

This is the first time that Levi's works are collected in a single edition in English, and that each of Levi's works is presented to English-speaking readers with its contents laid out in the order originally intended by Levi himself. It is also the first time that the complete works of any Italian author are translated and collected in English as a single project.
